

REGULATIONS OF THE UK CHAMPIONSHIPS – 2025

GENERAL INFORMATION

In the **2025** season, the UK Championships will consist of a series of 9 tournaments, held from March to **December**. The dates of the stages set during the organizational meeting should not change.

The **maximum number of teams** in one tournament cannot exceed **24**, although exceptions may be made if the organizer can ensure adequate logistical support for the event.

REGISTRATION

Registration opens automatically with the **first official poster publication** of a specific tournament. Teams that finished in **places 1–22** in the previous stage have priority registration for the next tournament (up to **5 days after the registration opens**).

Participation is confirmed by paying an entry fee of £190 per team.

Registrations are accepted based on the order of payment.

GROUP DRAW AND ADVANCEMENT

The group draw takes place 2–5 days before the tournament via live Facebook broadcast or on-site on the tournament day.

If two teams from the same club end up in the same group, the organizer reserves the right to **move the second drawn team to another group**.

Regardless of the tournament format, the **top 8 teams from the group stage** advance to the **quarterfinals**. The next **8 best teams** that did not qualify for the main phase will compete in the **President's Cup quarterfinals**.

Advancement from the group stage is determined by:

- 1. Points scored. In case of a tie:
 - a) Goal difference
 - b) **Goals scored** (e.g., 16:8 is better than 8:0 and 18:11).
 - c) If still tied, the **head-to-head result** determines advancement.
 - d) If multiple teams are tied, a **mini-table** will be created based on points and goals. If still tied, the **organizer's decision (e.g., coin toss or penalty shootout)** will determine advancement.

PLAYERS

Each team can have a **maximum of 12 players per tournament**. Breaching this rule means **no points in the general classification**, but the team can still compete for tournament prizes.

Over the entire **2025** championship season, each team can register a maximum of **30** players. Exceeding this limit may result in **zero points** for that tournament, although the team may continue to participate.

Before each tournament, the **team captain must submit a player list** to the organizer. Failure to submit this list will result in a **2-point deduction** in the general classification.

PLAYER TRANSFERS:

- Both involved teams and the Championship Manager must be informed about any transfer.
- A "player loan" is permitted in special cases (e.g., injuries or incomplete squads) with the manager's approval.
- Transfers can occur **up to the 7th stage**. Players participating in the **7th stage cannot transfer** afterward.
- A maximum of 3 players can be exchanged between the A and B squads of the same club between tournaments.

The organizer provides **basic first aid** but is not legally responsible for any injuries or incidents during the matches.

GENERAL CLASSIFICATION SCORING

Points awarded per tournament:

- 1 point: Team registers but does not attend.
- 2 points: Group stage elimination.
- 3 points: President's Cup qualification.
- 4 points: President's Cup runner-up.
- 5 points: President's Cup winner.
- 6 points: Quarterfinal exit.
- 7 points: 4th place.
- 8 points: 3rd place.
- 9 points: 2nd place.
- 10 points: Tournament winner.
- +3 points: Teams participating in all 9 tournaments.
- -3 points: Team expelled from a tournament.

DISCIPLINARY RULES

- Yellow card: 2-minute suspension, no reduction if a goal is conceded.
- **Red card:** Suspension for the rest of the match.
- **Direct red card:** Possible suspension of **0–99 matches**, decided by the Championship Manager.

Severe violations may result in:

- Team/player expulsion from the tournament.
- · Financial penalties.
- · Points deduction.

GAME RULES

- Match duration depends on the number of participants, but not shorter than 12 minutes.
- **5+1 system** (5 field players + 1 goalkeeper).
- · No studded shoes.
- No sliding tackles to win the ball.
 - Players cannot perform sliding tackles to take the ball away from an opponent.
 - Sliding tackles are only allowed to prevent the ball from going out of play or block a goal attempt.
 - Players should imagine a **1-meter radius** around the opponent with the ball. A sliding tackle within this space will be considered a foul.
- Goalkeepers can leave the penalty area and score goals.
- Goalkeepers cannot handle deliberate back-passes.
- Free kicks can be taken directly.
- Wall distance: 4 meters.
- · No offsides.
- · Rolling substitutions.

Penalty Shootout – Socca Style:

- A 1-on-1 duel between the shooter and the goalkeeper.
- The shooter has **10 seconds** from the referee's whistle to score a goal.
- The shooter starts **from the center line**, and the goalkeeper must remain on the **goal line** until the whistle.
- A foul by the goalkeeper results in an automatic goal for the attacking team.
- A foul by the attacker stops the play immediately.
- The ball is considered dead when it leaves the field, is caught by the goalkeeper, or the 10 seconds expire.
- The shooter can attempt unlimited rebounds within the 10-second limit.

For unaddressed situations, standard 11-a-side football rules apply.
